



Child Care Resource and Referral (Dutchess and Putnam)

- · Provides information to parents on locating child care, consumer education, referrals, subsidies, services for families
- · Recruits child care providers, provides start-up information and technical assistance in meeting regulatory requirements
- · Provides the community with education on child care issues and current data needed in planning for community services
- ·Supports employers in planning, implementing and providing employee child care services
- · Offers Quality Improvement initiatives to child care providers
- · Facilitates regular Professional Development for all Regulated Child Care Programs

Child Care Registration (Dutchess and Putnam)

- · Provides supervision of 49 family day care homes in Dutchess and 10 in Putnam
- · Provides supervision of 37 school age programs in Dutchess, and 8 in Putnam
- · Includes processing new and renewal applications, monitoring and inspecting programs, providing technical assistance and investigating complaints

Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP) (Dutchess and Putnam)

- · Supports group and family day care providers in serving nutritious meals and snacks to children in their care
- · Manages the CACFP federal reimbursement program for participating providers
- · Provided 327,076 meals & snacks in 2024

Health Care Consultancy Services (Dutchess and Putnam)

- · Registered Nurse on staff conducts training on health issues for child care providers
- · Reviews and approves health care plans for medication administration
- · Conducts training for medication administration

Day Care Subsidy Administration (Putnam)

· Manages the subsidized day care services program

Infant-Toddler Technical Assistance (Dutchess and Putnam)

· Infant Toddler Specialist and Infant/ Early Childhood Mental Health Consultant provide training and technical assistance to providers who care for children ages birth through five years.

Resource Lending Library (Dutchess and Putnam)

· Onsite lending library consists of toys, equipment, teaching units and professional resources

Child Care Tuition Scholarship Program (Dutchess)

- · Administers child care scholarships to income-eligible families whose children attend regulated child care programs in Dutchess County. Funded by the Dyson Foundation
- · Provided scholarships for 10 children, totaling \$45,147 in 2024.

Professional Development (Dutchess and Putnam)

- · Provides opportunities for child care providers to take trainings in the ten required topic areas
- · Training opportunities may be held at the Child Care Council (41 trainings) or at the program site (13 trainings)
- · Quarterly cluster meetings for home-based child care providers

Business Services (Dutchess and Putnam)

- · Provides child care business trainings
- · Assists child care programs with program budget creation
- · Offers individualized child care business technical assistance

Legally Exempt Enrollment Services

- · Provides support to 123 enrolled LE providers in Dutchess County & 7 in Putnam County
- · Includes new & renewed applications, annual inspections and providing technical assistance to programs

How did Champions of Child Care get started?

For many years the Child Care Council of Dutchess and Putnam, Inc. held a luncheon at a local restaurant for its Annual Meeting with speakers, election of the Board of Directors and recognition of child care providers. The recognition of providers was at the end of the meeting and as the program seemed to last longer each year, many in the audience had returned to work before the recognition took place.

Then in 2003, a small group of us decided "to give it a shot" and host an event solely to recognize and honor child care providers. There was little time to plan, so we hoped it would all come together. We had no intention of doing this again.

Approximately 100 people attended (more than we had anticipated) at the Poughkeepsie Grand Hotel. The son of one of the Council staff entertained with a spectacular tap dancing routine and everyone enjoyed a delicious dinner. The rest of the evening was devoted to presenting awards and honoring child care providers. As people were leaving, we were overwhelmed with the many sincere thank you's. But one family day provider's comment made all the difference as she said, "I was planning to close my doors because I felt discouraged and unappreciated. But after tonight I feel appreciated and I'm staying open."

That one comment gave us the reason and the inspiration to continue to celebrate the many dedicated, caring and passionate people who care for our children every day.

How do you decide who receives a Milestone or Education Award?

A flyer is sent by mail and electronically to all regulated child care providers asking for years of service in five year increments and any educational achievements received within the past 12 months.

How do people nominate child care providers?

About 2 months before the Champions Event, we invite anybody to submit a nomination for any child care provider in Dutchess and Putnam Counties. We send this form electronically to all parents and providers on our mailing list and through the postal service to all regulated child care providers. We ask this to be shared across all social media outlets and ask that it be given to all parents in child care programs. The link to our online nomination form is available on our website and also through our Facebook page. Many reminders are sent out electronically during the nomination period.

Since 2003 we have received approximately 3436 nominations!

How do you choose the Special Awards Winners?

After all of the nominations have been submitted, the Champions of Child Care Committee spends about a week reading through all of them on our own. We then come together and vote on the nominations that were written to decide the most deserving of the award in each category. We do not count the number of nominations or decide the winner based on the number of nominations submitted for that program or individual.

How do you choose what the theme is?

There are evaluation forms on the tables at the Champions Event. We ask for feedback in all areas of the event.

How did COVID-19 impact Champions of Child Care?

Because of COVID-19, 2023 was the first Champions of Child Care event since 2019. We had begun 2020 preparations, but sadly had to cancel. We were very disappointed! During the pandemic is where child care providers shone their brightest! Since we had already opened the Nomination submission form, we decided to continue to receive and send the recipients all of the kind words that were submitted. We sent over 300 messages to providers! We also sent each provider a certificate of appreciation to show our support.

Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP)

Do you care for children in your home while their parents are at work or school? Would you like help serving healthy food to the children in your care?

This food program helps you pay for meals and snacks served to children up to age 13 enrolled in your care. Most home day care providers are eligible and joining is free.





What are the benefits of CACFP?

Children are served nutritious meals and snacks and develop healthy eating habits that will last a lifetime.

Parents know their children are eating safe, healthy meals and snacks. Parents don't have to pack food to bring to child care.

Providers receive regular training and guidance about many nutrition, mealtime, and child development topics. The reimbursement helps providers buy healthier foods.

Communities benefit through CACFP. Studies show that children enrolled in CACFP have healthier diets and are not sick as often as other children. CACFP payments to providers help reduce child care costs for working families.

Professional Development

Monthly trainings on a variety of topics, covering the OCFS required topic areas

Monthly First Aid/CPR trainings (on Saturday mornings)

Babysitting Class for youth ages 10-16 (on Saturday mornings – usually 2-3 times a year)

Onsite training fees: 8-12-\$120.00 hourly rate 13-17-\$170.00 hourly rate 18-22-\$220.00 hourly rate Any amount over 22 particip

Any amount over 22 participants is calculated at \$10.00 per participants per hour of training.

Don't have a minimum of 8 staff for an onsite training? Buddy up with another program(s)/provider(s) to share the cost of a training.

The second Sunday in May has long been recognized as the day to honor mothers and their commitment to children. The Friday before Mother's Day, May 9, 2025, is Child Care Provider Appreciation Day, a special day to recognize child care providers, teachers, school-age program staff, child care center directors and staff, and all those who work with children and are responsible for their education and care. It is estimated that nearly 11 million children under age 5 are cared for by 2.8 million child care providers in the United States.

Provider Appreciation Day began in 1996 by a group of volunteers in New Jersey who saw the need to recognize the tireless efforts of providers who care for children of working parents. Momentum and support for this event has grown each year, and recognition presently includes individuals and government organizations throughout

North America, Europe, and Asia.
