A CCR&R is the go-to source for early care and education. We help to ensure that all young children have the kinds of early learning experiences that promote school and lifelong success. We provide information to parents on locating child care, consumer education, referrals, subsidies, and services for families. We recruit child care providers, provide start-up information and technical assistance in meeting regulatory requirements. We provide the community with education on child care issues and current data needed in planning for community services and support employers in planning, implementing and providing employee child care services.

The Child Care Council of Dutchess and Putnam, Inc.'s free referral service offers assistance in many areas pertaining to numerous aspects of child care, including but not limited to day care referrals, summer recreation information, nursery schools, pre-k programs and cost and subsidy information.

The Child Care Council of Dutchess and Putnam, Inc.'s day care referrals are not recommendations for child care. Providers are referred using information supplied by the parent as to hours of care needed, location, school district and any other applicable information. Parents are encouraged to visit the day care and meet with provider(s) before enrolling their child.

# Registration

The Child Care Council oversees the registration of Family Day Care (FDC) and School Age Child Care (SACC)

Family Day Care Homes - provide care for three to six children at a time in a residence; may add one or two school-age children. The maximum allowable number of children will depend on the number of infants in care.

**School-Age Child Care Programs** - provide care for more than six children from kindergarten through age twelve. Care for children during non-school hours; also may provide care during school vacation and holidays.

The class is eight (8) hours of training and includes a video training component as well as hands-on-demonstrations

Registered/licensed child care providers are required to complete thirty (30) hours of training every two years. The thirty (30) hours of training must address the following topics: Principles of childhood development, focusing on the developmental age groups for which they provide care; nutrition and health needs of children; child day care program development; safety and security procedures; business record maintenance and management; child abuse and maltreatment identification and prevention; statutes and regulations pertaining to child day care; statutes and regulations pertaining to child abuse and maltreatment; the education and information on the identification, diagnosis, and prevention of Shaken Baby Syndrome. The Child Care Council of Dutchess & Putnam, Inc. provides training in these areas at our office or at the program site.

## **Child and Adult Care Food Program**

The Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP) provides reimbursement for nutritious meals and snacks served to children while in child care. These meals must meet the nutritional standards set by the United States Department fo Agriculture. Through CACFP, nationally more than 4.2 million children receive nutritious meals and snacks each day as part of the car they receive.

## **Health and Safety**

A Legally Exempt provider is an unlicensed, informal child care provider who cares for up to 2 unrelated children and receives payment from the Department of Social Services. Eligibility is based upon the parent's eligibility to receive subsidy services and the provider's ability to meet certain criteria.

The Child Care Council performs inspections on a percentage of Legally Exempt providers and uses grant money to purchase supplies to improve the Health and Safety of these programs.


## Subsidy

In both Dutchess and Putnam Counties, a parent may qualify for a low income child care subsidy to help pay for child care. In Dutchess County that is through the Department of Community and Family Services and in Putnam County. The Department of Social Services handles the subsidies. In 2017, both counties' eligibility levels to qualify for a subsidy was at 200% of the federal poverty level. That translates to a family of three earning up to \$41,560.


